In such a case, the invitation to travel to Japan would be cancelled and the applicant would take the exam remotely at his/her place of residence.</p>	<p>After passing the initial screening, selected students will enroll as research students in a non-degree program of the Department of Genetics. Travel expenses to Japan will be supported by the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship. To be admitted to a PhD program, research students must apply to our graduate program through the General Admission procedure.</p>	<p>Applicants will take an on-site exam held at NIG (Mishima, Japan). Financial support during a Ph.D. program	<p>A limited number of NIG-GS applicants who pass the tertiary screening and satisfy certain conditions will be offered a monthly stipend (approx. 140,000 JPY), tuition support, and airfare to and from Japan at the beginning and upon completion of the program as long as he/she remains a student in good standing.</p> <p>Other candidates who passed the tertiary screening will be offered partial financial support equivalent to students enrolled through General Admission.</p>	Students will be supported by the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship.	<p>Students will be offered a monthly stipend of approx. 60,000 JPY for working as a Research Assistant. Tuition may be waived if students with financial difficulties and outstanding academic records pass the screening.</p>
Others	All international graduate students are provided with free Japanese lessons (usually two hours/month). The NIG dormitories are available for students.
